#### **Palmetto Academic Letter**

Students (9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>) who maintain a score of 85 or higher in each course for the first three nine-week periods of the school year at the time Q3 grades are stored will be identified as a Palmetto Academic Letter recipient. These students will receive an academic letter or subsequent bar during the school day at the Academic Award's Picnic.

Selection for membership in the Palmetto High School BETA Club is based on outstanding scholarship, character, leadership, and service.

9<sup>th</sup> graders are NOT eligible for BETA club.

10<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> graders must achieve a cumulative weighted GPA of 3.5 or higher and have no disciplinary infractions.

Continued membership is dependent on the following areas of performance:

- ✓ Members must maintain a cumulative weighted GPA of 3.5 or higher. GPA's will be checked at the end of each school year.
- ✓ Members must meet a <u>minimum</u> service requirement of 4 service projects 1 submitted by the end of each quarter grading period.
- ✓ Members must have a clean disciplinary record. Any type of suspension will result in at least probation. Any disciplinary action due to violation of civic laws or cheating/dishonesty will result in immediate and permanent dismissal.

Seniors who remain in good standing will receive an honor cord at Award's Day to be worn at graduation.

#### **National Honor Society**

Junior and senior level students with a cumulative weighted 4.3 GPA at the end of their sophomore year will be invited to join NHS in the fall. Requirements for membership include maintaining a cumulative 4.3 GPA and completing 4 service projects - 1 submitted by the end of each quarter grading period. Students who fail to maintain a cumulative 4.3 GPA after the probationary period will be dismissed. Once a student is dismissed, they are no longer eligible for NHS. Rounding averages are not included in the 4.3 eligibility requirement. In order to graduate with a National Honor Society credential, students must qualify during their senior year. Seniors who remain in good standing will receive an honor stole at Award's Day to be worn at graduation.
